A Time for Everything

Perhaps you are experiencing a big change in your life right now. Maybe you have a big change coming. Maybe it's a new job or a child is moving out of the house or a wedding is planned or health reasons dictate a change in lifestyle. Most of us, if we are honest with ourselves, don't really like change. We tend to be 'creatures of habit'.

The preacher in Ecclesiastes chapter 3 says, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven". The writer then goes on for seven verses giving examples such as: "a time to be born, and a time to die"; "a time to keep silence, and a time to speak"; and "a time to keep, and a time to cast away". He goes on to say that "He (God) has made everything beautiful in its time..." (v 11). He continues in verse 12 by saying "I perceive that there is nothing better for them than to be joyful and to do good as long as they live."

No matter where we are in life, God does want us to be joyful and do good. In order to have the joy God intends, we must obey Him by living according to His standards, not ours. If you find yourself facing a big change right now, we encourage you to focus on God and find His joy by doing good through obedience to him. If we can help you, we would love to do so.

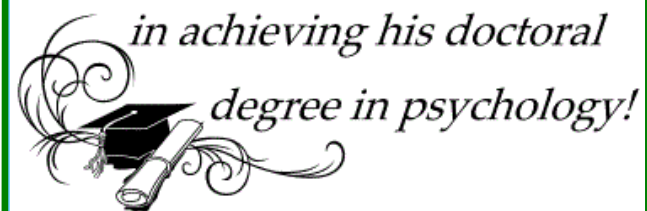

Hello and welcome to worship!

Tonight, Phil and I are giving an update on Honduras. Honduras was a great experience I will always remember. The campaign is called a medical campaign and it is to help the people physically, but the main emphasis for the week is to help spiritually. It is an

opportunity to share the gospel with these people. They ask each patient if they want a Bible study and many did. They also invite people to the week-long gospel meeting that goes on every evening. Here are some statistics of the week-long campaign. There were 348 Bible studies with 507 people in the Bible Studies. There were 359 children in daytime Bible classes with 162 in evening Bible classes. We had 360 people in evening worship and 33 visitors to evening worship. There were 114 in teen's Bible class and 25 in the new converts class each evening. We were blessed with 8 baptisms and 3 restorations. There were 969 total registrants on the medical side of the campaign. 960 patients visited doctors and 1,114 pharmacy patients. 4,725 prescriptions were issued and 97 patients received physical therapy. 1,343 pairs of glasses were provided. This campaign was the talk of the town and it was the happening place each day. This town has around 1,300 people and we had 969 people register, if that gives you an idea. We are extremely thankful for this congregation's support and we were all blessed by being a part of such a special trip.

Praise the Lord! Alex Davison was baptized into Christ a week ago Thursday. His parents are Brad and Ashleigh Davison. He was baptized at their home. Alex, we all want you to know how proud we are of you!



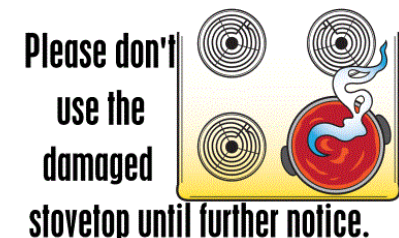

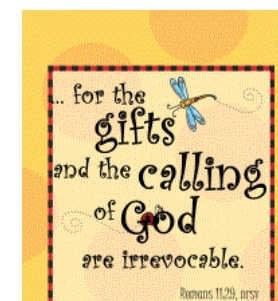
