A thought that often crosses my mind in reading fiction is, "Who is the inspiration behind these characters?" What inspired J.K Rowling to write about the fanciful world of *Harry Potter*? Was there a particular person that she was thinking about as she wrote about Harry? In some novels, we know exactly who inspired the characters like those in *The Little House on the Prairie* series (autobiographical fiction). How would you feel if you found out that a book's character was based on your life? How would that character act? Would you be a hero or a villain? Would you be the trusty sidekick or the pesky adversary?

In the most remarkable book of all time, we see many sidekicks and adversaries. Paul names three men, Hymenaeus, Alexander, and Philetus, who are adversaries of the faith when writing to Timothy (1 Tim 1:19-20; 2 Tim 2:17-18; 4:14). In his third epistle, the apostle John names Diotrephes as an individual who loves the place of authority and speaks wickedness against John (3 John 9-10). What about the trusty sidekicks? You can generally look at the end of Paul's letters and see a great list of sidekicks (Romans, 1 Corinthians, etc.) In Philippians, Paul explicitly mentions Timothy and Epaphroditus as men who live out their faith. These were men who displayed great humility in seeking after the interest of others. These were men who had the same mindset as Christ (Phil 2:5). Can you imagine Paul using *your* name as one who is faithful?!

Even though we missed the time we could have had our name in the Bible, we now look forward to our name being in a better book, the Lamb's book of life (Phil 4:3; Rev 21:27). Here is the interesting thing though, this book does not have the names of the adversaries. The only names in this book have placed their trust in Jesus and have lived their lives faithfully. Do you remember the time that you desperately wanted your name to be on a list? Maybe it was a list of the varsity squad or getting accepted into a program of some sort. Your eyes scan down to the area of your last name, looking and looking. Surely you know exactly what I'm talking about. Imagine Jesus saying, "I can't find your name." Imagine Him inviting you to look over the book with Him. We are either in that book, or we are not. Who are you today? Are you Jesus' sidekick, or are you His adversary?
